FR. 42 –

Compensatory allowance:-compensation due to additional expenditure. These are not income e.g. HRA, WA, HA, MA and are divided into three categories :-

SR. 19 (b) on joining time:- { contradicts SR 17 (i). SR 17(i) should be deleted }
