

Chapter - IX

Compulsory retirement

FR. 57

- a) Compulsory retirement on reaching 58 years of age. As a punishment vide DAP rules :- Compulsory Pension.
- b) Govt. may retire a govt. servant after he has attained 50 years of age or has completed 20 years of service (as amended w.e.f. January 1988) by giving him a notice in writing of not less than 3 months

OR

in lieu of such notice, three months' pay and allowances.

- c) Voluntary retirement: A Govt. servant may retire from service after he has attained 50 years of age or completed 20 years of service, whichever is earlier by giving three months' notice to government.

Note:- In such cases, day of retirement will be treated as non-working day.

If date of retirement is on:-

- (a) The 1st of the month then that day is a 'non-duty day'
- (b) End of the month then that day is a 'duty day'
- (c) Any day after the 1st of the month, then retirement is on the last day of the month.

Note:- Group D retires at 60 years of age. If promoted to duftry/jamadar/head chowkidar/head mali/head sweeper, he shall retire at 60 years. No. FEG 39/86/70 dt. 24th June, 1998
